	This programme is designed to coach you in acquiring fluidity in Process Work skills and metaskills. You will be invited and required to create clearly delineated projects of your interest, involving presenting and/ or teaching aspects of Process Work in different contexts, and to do so without using the terminology of Process Work. (We are happily borrowing this from Poland's training programme!) Your coach will support you in dreaming, developing, implementing and evaluating your project, and in giving you the 'go ahead' to the next one – the next aspect and level of training. We will weave with you an individualized step by step approach to learning, which requires learning to work with feedback from your coach, the environment, and your inner life, following the 'process mind', while recognizing milestones and taking in hand the progression of your professional studies.		

	<p>This is a new, model programme. We anticipate it continuing in a three - year cycle. The coaches are Arlene, Jean-Claude and Jan. Arlene and Jean-Claude will be the coaches for this first set, and Jan will join in the next cycle. Feedback from students will be warmly invited into the development of this programme.</p> <p><u>Friday Evenings: Case control</u> When: 6:30 – 8:30 pm Feb 12th March 26th, October 15th and Dec 10th Open for all students and practitioners of process work</p> <p>This is an evening of case control. Each person will have a chance to present a case. We will ask you to present your case according to new guidelines. A three- year cycle means that each student will have one main coach per year, and then rotate their coach in the second and third years. The participants will be required to teach Process Work within a particular outer context of their choice; study their work; present and analyse their learning edges, difficulties and creative growth; develop skills and metaskills for giving feedback and evaluating students; including video studies, case studies and dissertations.
